Officers currently serving on active duty under the 2017 VRRAD program whose tour lengths are limited to 12 months may apply for tour extensions under this program. 

### THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

July 2, 1776 - The Continental Congress in Philadelphia adopted the following resolution, originally introduced on June 7, by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia: "Resolved, That these United Colonies are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States, that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved. That it is expedient forthwith to take the most effectual measures for forming foreign Alliances. That a plan of confederation be prepared and transmitted to the respective Colonies for their consideration and approbation."

### **Veterans Homes History**

**1887:** The history began shortly after the Civil War. Because of the devastation brought on by that conflict, there was a growing conviction that provisions

should be made for the care of the nation's Veterans. The Minnesota legislature authorized the Minnesota Soldiers' Home in 1887 as a reward to the brave and deserving, and a Board of Trustees was established to manage the facility.

**1930's:** On November 11, 1934, construction of Building 9 on the Minneapolis campus was started. Completed in 1937, Building 9 was constructed almost entirely by hand over a span of nearly three years. The building was demolished in 2009 and was replaced with a 100 bed skilled care facility that was completed and dedicated in 2012.

**1960's:** The view that Soldiers' Homes were rest homes persevered in Minnesota until the 1960s. In 1968, for example, the Minneapolis Soldiers' Home was licensed for 56 nursing care beds and 375 boarding care beds, the latter of which represented primarily custodial (non medical) care.

**1970's:** In 1972 a new nursing care facility was constructed on the Minneapolis campus, and another was built by 1980. In 1978, the old state hospital in Hastings was converted into a domiciliary residence for Veterans. The Hastings State Hospital was opened in 1900 and closed on May 1, 1978.

**1980's:** In 1988, the legislature reorganized and separated the Veterans Homes from the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs. The Veterans Homes Board of Directors was established, consisting of nine members appointed by the governor.

**1990's:** Over the next 10 years three more facilities were added, bringing the total in Minnesota to five. The breakdown of the beds was as follows: Minneapolis, 346 skilled nursing care beds and 77 domiciliary beds; Hastings, 200 domiciliary beds; Silver Bay, 89 skilled nursing care beds; Luverne, 85 skilled nursing care beds, and Fergus Falls, 85 skilled nursing care beds.

**2007:** On November 19, 2007, the Veterans Home Board was eliminated and the duties and responsibilities were transferred to the Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs.

2009: Building 9 at the Minneapolis Veterans Home was scheduled for replacement in 2009.

**2.5 million** - In July 1776, the estimated number of people living in the newly independent nation.

### **Towns with Patriotic Names**

- 31 Places have "liberty" in their names. The most populous one as of April 1, 2010, is Liberty, Mo. (2,339) lowa, with four, has more of these places than any other state: Libertyville, New Liberty, North Liberty and West Liberty.
- 35 Places have "eagle" in their names. The most populous one is Eagle Pass, Texas (26,248).
- 11 Places have "independence" in their names. The most populous one is Independence, Mo. (116,830).
- 9 Places have "freedom" in their names. The most populous one is New Freedom, Pa. (4,464).
- 1 One place with "patriot" in the name. Patriot, Ind. (209).
- 5 Places have "America" in their names. The most populous is American Fork, Utah (26,263).

More than 1 in 4 - The chance that the hot dogs and pork sausages consumed on the Fourth of July originated in Iowa. The Hawkeye State was home to 19.0 million hogs and pigs on March 1, 2011. This estimate represents more than one-fourth of the nation's estimated total. North Carolina (8.6 million) and Minnesota (7.6 million) were also homes to large numbers of pigs.

**Over 1 in 3** - The odds that your side dish of baked beans originated from North Dakota, which produced 36 percent of the nation's dry, edible beans in 2010. Another popular Fourth of July side dish is corn on the cob. Florida, California, Georgia, Washington and New York together accounted for 68 percent of the fresh market sweet corn produced nationally in 2010.

July 3, 1775 - During the American Revolution, George Washington took command of the Continental Army at Cambridge, Massachusetts.

July 4, 1776 - The Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress.

July 19, 1863 - During the
American Civil War, Union
troops made a second attempt
to capture Fort Wagner near
Charleston, South Carolina. The
attack was led by the 54th Massachusetts Colored Infantry,
commanded by Colonel Robert
Gould Shaw, who was killed
along with half of the 600 men
in the regiment. This battle
marked the first use of black
Union troops in the war.

July 20, 1969 - A global audience watched on television as Apollo 11 Astronaut Neil Armstrong took his first step onto the moon.

July 24, 1943 - During World War II in Europe, the Royal Air Force conducted Operation Gomorrah, raiding Hamburg, while tossing bales of aluminum foil strips overboard to cause German radar screens to see a blizzard of false echoes. As a result, only twelve of 791 Allied bombers involved were shot down.

July 24, 1945 - At the conclusion of the Potsdam
Conference in Germany,
Winston Churchill, Harry
Truman and China's representatives issued a demand
for unconditional Japanese
surrender. The Japanese,
unaware the demand was
backed up by an Atomic
bomb, rejected the Potsdam Declaration on July
26.


