THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

July 14, 1789 - The fall of the Bastille occurred at the beginning of the French Revolution.

The Minnesota GI Bill provides funding for eligible applicants who are in a Title IV eligible certificate, diploma, undergraduate or graduate program.

The Minnesota GI Bill can also be used for:

Undergraduate or graduate admission tests (e.g. SAT, GRE, LSAT)

A preparatory course for a qualifying admission test

National tests providing an opportunity for course credit at institutions of higher learning

More information about using your Minnesota GI Bill for test reimbursement can be found on the "Licensing and Certification" tab.

Applicants must fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Student Requirements

Applicants must be a Minnesota resident (defined by Minnesota Statute 136A.101) and

Under the age of 62 and,

Enrolled at a Minnesota institution

Applicants may receive up to \$3,000 per academic year

Apply online here (Note: the Minnesota GI Bill Online Application is not currently compatible with Internet Explorer). Applicants should also contact Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs.

Note: Applicants must reapply every year for the Minnesota GI Bill. Application for the Fall Semester opens every year in the spring of the year.

HOT OFF THE PRESS

'The Outpost' Powerfully Confronts the Contradictions of the War in Afghanistan

The Afghanistan War's Battle of Kamdesh in 2009 is a shining moment of military heroism in the face of failed strategy, a story of men who fought valiantly to win a battle that they should've never been asked to fight. "The Outpost" is the war picture these men deserve, a thrilling movie that drives home the impossibility of their situation and the resourcefulness they showed to survive an attack that realistically could have cost every man his life Movies about the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan have been thin on the ground as Hollywood continues to revisit Vietnam and the World Wars for inspiration. "The Outpost" was made independently on a razorthin budget but manages to deliver the goods without the support of a Hollywood studio budget. Based on "The Outpost: An Untold Story of American Valor," a 2013 best-selling book by CNN's Jake Tapper, the movie focuses on Staff Sgts. Clint Romesha and Ty Carter. Both men were awarded the Medal of Honor for their actions during the October battle but the movie recognizes the bravery of the entire unit as they defended the base.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

July 15, 1918 - During the Battle of the Marne in World War I, German General Erich Ludendorff launched Germany's fifth, and last, offensive to break through the Chateau-Thierry salient. However, the Germans were stopped by American, British and Italian divisions. On July 18, General Foch, Commander-in-Chief of the Allied troops, launched a massive counter-offensive. The Germans began a retreat lasting four months until they requested an armistice in November.

July 16, 1945 - The experimental Atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off at 5:30 a.m. in the desert of New Mexico desert, creating a mushroom cloud rising 41,000 ft. The bomb emitted heat three times the temperature of the interior of the sun and wiped out all plant and animal life within a mile.
