"The top attack system shall provide a lethal obstacle capability sufficient to [control] terrain by disrupting enemy maneuver and defeating threat forces," the document states. More new technology. THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

May 19, 1943 - During World War II in Europe, Royal Air Force bombers successfully attacked dams in the German Ruhr Valley using innovative ball-shaped bouncing bombs that skipped along the water and exploded against the dams. The dams had provided drinking water for 4 million persons and supplied 75% of the electrical power for industry in the area.

May 20, 1862 - President Abraham Lincoln signed the Homestead Act opening millions of acres of government owned land in the West to "homesteaders" who could acquire up to 160 acres by living on the land and cultivating it for five years, paying just \$1.25 per acre.

I've got my vaccine.

Have you? COVID-19 vaccinations dominate the headlines. Moderna. Pfizer. Johnson & Johnson. One dose. Two doses. Where and when to schedule an appointment?

I support the COVID-19 vaccine as a critical step toward achieving 80% of the population immunized, creating herd immunity, to overcome this pandemic. We will then be able to return to the things we miss and love. Spending time with extended family. Going to a ball game or concert. Dining out with a group of friends.

I received one shot in March and the other in April, both at the VA Medical Center in St. Cloud. I received the Moderna vaccine in March and had a good experience. After my first shot, I had soreness in my arm and a slight elevation in my temperature for two days. After my second shot, I again had soreness in my arm but no other side effects.

As a Veteran, I have served my state and my country for many years. Receiving the vaccine is one more act of service for our communities. Now that the vaccines are available to everyone age 16 and older, I strongly encourage you to get yours as soon as possible if you haven't already. Find out how to get your shot at <u>mn.gov/vaccine</u>. And sign up to be notified of vaccine appointments at <u>Minnesota COVID-19 Vaccine Connector</u>.

Our communities continue to be impacted by not only the coronavirus but are again reeling from the tragedy of the death of a young Black man by a police officer. The VA Is Testing an Implant That Could Allow Paralyzed Veterans to Walk Again

Five years ago, Marine Lance Cpl. Joshua Burch became the first paralyzed service member to walk to his own promotion ceremony, wearing an exoskeleton that helped him walk and stand to receive his corporal chevrons.

Now medically retired, Burch, 26, hopes again to be a trailblazer -- the first Department of Veterans Affairs patient to regain function in his lower body -to include taking steps -courtesy of an electrical implant in his spine that is designed to stimulate his body's sensorimotor networks.

"Even thinking about walking is crazy. I look at this as a stepping-stone to a future where others like me can walk. I look at my participation in this research as a way of helping people out," Burch said during an interview in March with Military.com. Researchers at Hunter Holmes McGuire VA Medical Center in Richmond, Virginia, have launched a study to determine whether epidural stimulators can help paralyzed veterans recover motor activity and/or control over their "inner systems" -- their cardiovascular and bladder functions, for example. While epidural stimulators have shown some degree of success with limb paralysis in research elsewhere, this is the first such study at the VA, explained Dr. Ashraf Gorgey, chief of spinal cord injury research at the Richmond hospital. May 21, 1881 - The American Red Cross was founded by Clara Barton. The organization today provides volunteer disaster relief in the U.S. and abroad. Community services include collecting and distributing donated blood, and teaching health and safety classes.

May 22, 1972 - President Richard Nixon became the first American president to visit Moscow. Four days later, Nixon and Soviet Russia's leader Leonid Brezhnev signed a pact pledging to freeze nuclear arsenals at current levels.

May 22, 1947 - Congress approved the Truman Doctrine, assuring U.S. support for Greece and Turkey to prevent the spread of Communism.


